It was a bit of a quiet month for your Town Board. Several lengthy discussions about town sidewalk maintenance and potential Fire Impact Fees on new development, but no formal action yet taken on either issue.

There are big topics that I think may be of interest.

First, the Board agreed to revise its policy and offer citizens that attend our meetings an opportunity to comment on each item on agenda, rather than only during the opening "public comments" time. This will allow each of you a chance to offer relevant input when the Board considers taking action on any number of issues.

Second, we've received a bunch of inquiries about the annual Egg Hunt. Unfortunately, it will not be occurring this year. However, as the Town continues its promising transition into a new method of planning events (via the Events Committee), the Egg Hunt and many other events should return better than ever in the upcoming months and years. We do sincerely apologize that Lochbuie's Egg Hunt will not occur this year, and we encourage everyone to consider participating in similar events in nearby communities.

REMINDER TO RESPECT YOUR NEIGHBORS

With the arrival of warm weather, we all want to enjoy the outdoors, work in our yards and celebrate with family and friends. In doing so, please respect your neighbors and follow the Town noise ordinance which

states: "No unreasonable audible noises within 25 feet from the source between the hours of 10 PM-7 AM." Unreasonable noises include: electrically amplified sound, non-licensed motor vehicle gasoline engines, non-vehicular gasoline engines and electric tools, repair or adjustment of motor vehicles and gatherings of persons engaged in loud and continuing activities continuing in excess of fifteen (15) minutes.
