The company who created the survey, Corona Insights, gave a presentation at a Board of Trustees meeting in July, and key findings from the results were shared. One of those key findings was:

2022 Town Election

On November 8th, the Town will hold a coordinated election with the statewide general election on tow different matters:

- The election of four trustees. As of print date of this newsletter, the Town anticipates five candidates' names will appear on the ballot for four trustee seats. The top three vote getters will serve for four year terms and the fourth highest vote getter will serve a two year term so that staggered terms of office are maintained on the Town Board.
- Whether or not the Town should form a Home Rule Charter Commission to draft a Home Rule Charter for the Town. Home Rule status is a different form of Town government that allows more autonomy at the local level. The current Town form of government is statutory which means that all the authorities of the local government to act must be set by state law. A charter is akin to a constitution for a state. If the voters agree, a charter commission will be formed who will be tasked with drafting such a charter and will be required to seek public input. Ultimately, the voters will at a future date vote on whether to approve the charter. This election gets that ball rolling. Seek out any Town official if you have any questions about Home Rule.

- If the voters agree to form a charter commission, as of print date of this newsletter, the Town anticipates nine candidates' names will appear on the ballot for nine charter commissioner seats.

- If the voters agree to form a charter commission, the commission will first meet on November 15 at 4:30 at Town Hall to start its work. All the commission meetings will be open to the public.
